The circumstances described below constitute a violation of the Texas Solid Waste Disposal Act. You are requested to inform Compliance Coordinator Elaine Savage in writing within ten (10) days of steps being taken to be in compliance with this law and to prevent recurrence. NATURE OF VIOLATION:

On February 26, 2018 at 2:20 p.m., Marisela Lozano of this office inspected your landfill located at 3510 Greenhouse Road. As a result of this investigation, a violation of the following section of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Municipal Solid Waste Regulations (Title 30 Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 330) was determined.


Section 330.165(g) Erosion gullies or washed-out areas deep enough to jeopardize the final or intermediate cover must be repaired within five days of detection by restoring the cover material, grading, compacting, and seeding unless the commission's regional office approves otherwise, based on the

extent of the damage requiring more time to repair or the repairs are delayed because of weather conditions. An eroded area is considered to be deep enough to jeopardize the final or intermediate cover if it exceeds four inches in depth as measured from the vertical plane from the erosion feature and the 90-degree intersection of this plane with the horizontal slope face or surface.

Our investigator observed erosion of intermediate cover more than 4 inches deep along the east side of the landfill. Landfill personnel failed to detect and repair the erosion of cover for at least two weeks.

Under Texas law you are subject to civil penalties of \$50 to \$25,000 per day, criminal penalties of up to \$250,000 per day or more for each violation, and possible confinement up to 10 years or more. Under the Regulations of Harris County for Storm Water Quality Management, you may be subject to civil penalties up to \$1,000 per day for each violation. A case-by-case review is conducted when each Violation Notice is issued. The ultimate disposition of each case is dependent upon factors such as the nature, magnitude and duration of this violation, steps taken to mitigate the violation, previous violations, and the contents of any response received. In the event that further enforcement action is appropriate, this office may file charges in a court of proper jurisdiction, as provided by law.
